Bell Tower Community Association cleans up again!

The Bell Tower Community Association held its fourth Community Tidy-Up Day on Saturday 7 August.

The association covers the area around Caversham Road in Reading, centred around E P Collier School with its famous bell tower. More than 100 local residents took the opportunity to dispose of unwanted household goods in a huge 40 cubic metre skip in the school playground.

The event, sponsored by Reading Festival promoters Festival Republic, filled the skip within 4 hours. Items left by local residents included furniture, mattresses, broken garden machinery and last year's Christmas trees.

A recycling service was provided for unwanted items in good condition, and new homes were found for several pieces of furniture and bikes, along with a set of Victorian style doors. The clean-up team also helped neighbours remove rubbish from their gardens.

David Neale from the Bell Tower Community Association said, "The Tidy-Up Day is so successful and has become a regular event in our area's calendar. With help from Festival Republic we are providing a very popular service to the community. It's a great opportunity for neighbours to work together to clear up their local area and we've been able to put plenty of unwanted items to good use."
