

News in brief

● The independent consultants brought in by Reading Borough Council have now finished their monitoring of overnight train noise in Cardiff Road. This testing came about largely as a result of our media campaign and pressure from Reading East MP Rob Wilson. The consultants will need a couple of weeks to complete their report and present it to the council and local residents. After that the council will decide whether it wants to take further steps. We are also waiting to see whether and how the council will carry out air pollution measurements in Cardiff Road.

Residents are continuing to report nuisance from the depot, which means Bell Tower has no intention of letting the matter drop and will continue to press all the parties involved to tackle the problem. We are eagerly awaiting the results of the noise monitoring and the council's response.
