THE BENDS: the obstacles that would have faced all traffic to the industrial estate

The Bell Tower Community Association managed to minimise the effects on the area of the planned closure of Tessa Road for filming. makers of "Greenland: Migration" originally wanted to divert all traffic, including articulated lorries, via Randolph, Addison and Cardiff Roads, with the Milford Road bollards being removed.

Bell Tower only found out about the plan when it was told by a friendly business, which shared our concern about the ability of lorries to negotiate Addison Road due to the sharp curve between it and Randolph Road and in particular the bend further along.

We contacted the Thames Ward councillors to voice our opposition to the closure and the alternative route which had been proposed on the advice of council officials.

We also suggested that if the closure was really necessary it would be better to take out the bollards in

Cardiff and Milford Roads temporarily. This route would minimise the number of residents affected and would be much easier for large vehicles to travel along.

We managed to persuade the council to opt for the Cardiff-Milford Road option. The film company's assistant location manager, Joel Punchard, emailed us to say: "My team and I wanted to email to formally apologise for not getting in touch with you about our project ... If we had been passed your contact information sooner, we would have reached out with the filming and road closure when we first approached the council about our intention."

They are now aware of our existence. We have also made it plain to ward councillor Adele Barnet-Ward that we were unhappy that the council did not consult residents, and are grateful to the business that tipped us off.
