The G-Team Cleans Up in Reading

The "G-Team" from the Bell Tower Community Association has just cleaned up the 100th piece of graffiti from its area.

The G-Team was set up this spring to tackle the growing amounts of graffiti in the local community. This small but dedicated team of volunteers has been cleaning up in their spare time ever since, with the help of cleaning kits from Reading Borough Council and assistance from local businesses and grateful residents.

Last weekend, after discovering a particularly bad graffiti attack in the area, the G-Team swung into action and removed over a dozen tags within 12 hours of their appearance.

Team Leader David Neale said, "It's making a difference, one brick at a time. We want to show that graffiti is something the community won't tolerate. By steadily removing old graffiti and making sure that anything new disappears as soon as it's found, we can show that local people care about their environment."

Teresa Colliass, Chairman of the Bell Tower Community Association, added, "People are pulling together to improve their neighbourhood, and it's a great example of community spirit."

The Community Association will be continuing its mission to clear up the neighbourhood by holding a Tidy-Up Day later this year, when a giant skip will be hired for residents to dispose of their rubbish. Last year over 10 tonnes of rubbish were collected and it's hoped that this year's event will be just as successful.
